

**HRB—SASA demands the following Asks be agreed to & implemented by the UCSB administration:**

UCSB resources must work on practices to make students feel safe, supported, and important. This may include, but is not limited to, quicker access to appointments, being provided with unbiased information on all next-step options, and not being discouraged from or encouraged to pursue any one option.

All campus resources [CACSW, Title IX, CARE, CAPS, Women's Center, UCPD\*, the Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs, the Department of Recreation] must be required to attend an open town hall each quarter of the academic school year for students to voice their questions and concerns. The timing of this event must be confirmed with HRB—SASA at least three weeks in advance— along with any administrative reports that will be discussed at the Town Hall— and will be at a time that is optimal for student schedules (after 5pm). The town hall would last at least two hours and the date of the event would be provided to the public at least two weeks in advance, along with the agenda and administrative reports.

UCSB must provide HRB—SASA with five thousand dollars annually and by the start of the fiscal year— beginning in 2019— in order to organize a campus-wide campaign regarding affirmative consent.

The UCSB Title IX office must provide an annual Public Accountability Report as modeled by the UCLA Title IX office. The UCSB Title IX office must redesign their website to make the information more accessible to students, faculty, and staff.

UCSB must make CARE's Standard of Excellence Training mandatory for OSL organizations and sports teams/clubs.

The CARE office must provide online access to their Standard of Excellence Training modules regarding healthy relationships and sexual violence and sexual harassment prevention.

UCSB must provide online access to the Gaucho FYI content. HRB—SASA must be provided an opportunity to contribute to and review Gaucho FYI material upon any decisions to alter any content.

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\*All entities representing UCPD must be dressed in casual civilian clothing.



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
